	<b>Females</b>	<b>Males</b>
<b>Suits</b>	A suit always looks professional. Be sure to keep suits clean and wrinkle-free.	A suit always looks professional. Be sure to keep suits clean and wrinkle-free.
<b>Tops</b>	No t-shirts. A blouse, sweater, or button-down shirt of any kind is appropriate. Dresses are also appropriate as long as they are not revealing and adequate in length.	No t-shirts. A collared/button-down shirt is appropriate, and do not forget a tie.
<b>Bottoms</b>	No jeans or shorts. Slacks and suit-pants are acceptable. Skirts must be worn with pantyhose/stockings and should not be more than two inches above the knee. Bottoms should have a subtle pattern; avoid loud designs.	No jeans or shorts. Slacks, preferable in dark colors, are appropriate.
<b>Shoes</b>	No sneakers or open-toe sandals. Remember: high-heeled shoes may look pretty, but they can also be very uncomfortable, so use your discretion.	No sneakers or open-toe sandals. Loafers or other types of dress shoes are preferred.
<b>Hair</b>	Keep hair clean; out of face	Keep hair clean; out of face
