1. Calls upon wealthy and developed countries to donate and support this cause by helping us raise \$35 billion;
2. Encourages the formation of an infrastructure bank to help under-developed nations;
3. Educates citizens to practice safe feces disposal and hygiene;
4. Uses recyclable materials to create toilets;
5. Creates pit latrines out of reusable and recyclable items;
6. Makes water systems out of recycled materials;
7. Improves people's sanitary lives in public areas;
8. Lowers cost ways of purifying water; and
9. Supports other organizations trying to achieve the same goals we have.
