Deeply concerned by this topic because of its impact on human life,

Observing the growth in human population,

Alarmed by the number of people impacted by food insecurity,

- 1. Approves of fundraisers all over the world;
- 2. Recommends the development of food banks;
- 3. Encourages making agriculture, forestry and fisheries more productive and sustainable;
- 4. Draws attention to planting more foods that are traditional to a country;
- 5. Considers building food storage containers and shipping them where needed;
- 6. Expresses the hope that member states will send materials to farmers;
- 7. Encourages the development of a food share program and making more nutritious food;

- 8. Calls upon farmers to donate food;
- 9. Urges member states to use water filtration for healthy and clean water and requests the development of desalination plants;
- 10. Supports healthy school lunch programs;
- 11. Notes that factories can pollute water and soil;
- 12. Encourages the development of solar farms and an increased amount of solar panels;
- 13. Recommends making community gardens where people work and get a share of food and goods through a co-op;
- 14. Encourages volunteers to educate parents on becoming food secure;
- 15. Supports the creation of a market where people can buy and sell food and goods;
- 16. Requests support from corporations;
- 17. Further requests the development of new farmland and food production techniques;
- 18. Encourages volunteers to teach people how to fish and farm;
- 19. Encourages the usage of biofortification, a way to add more nutrients to food;
- 20. Calls upon member states to research crops that grow in harsh climates;
- 21. Considers easier access and more effective distribution of food;
- 22. Considers a group of sponsors that could donate nutritional foods to schools.
