Topic: Situation in Syria

Co-Sponsors: Rwanda, Australia, United States, Chad, China, Russia, Chile, France, Jordan, Argentina, Azerbaijan, and the United

Kingdom, and Korea

The Security Council, taking note of past failure to follow through on resolutions, <u>Deeply concerned</u> that humanitarian aid workers are not able to access internally displaced civilians,

<u>Fully believing</u> in the UN Special Envoy to Syria Staffan de Mistura's actions in negotiating temporary freeze zones, especially in Aleppo,

<u>Deeply convinced</u> that humanitarian aid workers should be able to access internally displaced civilians as well as refugees,

Alarmed by the growth of terrorist organizations,

<u>Deeply disturbed</u> by the war crimes being committed in Syria,

<u>Viewing</u> with appreciation the progress in the removal of chemical weapons,

Reaffirming the Security Council's commitment to delivering aid within Syria,

- 1. Accepts that aiding the Syrian people will require sufficient funding;
- 2. Calls upon all sides to enter negotiations without preconditions;
- 3. Draws attention towards the despicable acts of growing amount of terrorist organizations occurring within Syria that include war crimes, crimes against humanity and even genocide;
- 4. Recommends the support of the Syrian Sunrise Foundation and other organizations supporting the displaced civilians of the crisis;
- 5. Requests the Syrian government to authorize the use of United Nations peacekeepers to protect civilians and deliver aid to those afflicted;

- 6. Further recommends moderate rebels and the Syrian government to negotiate peaceful resolutions without preconditions;
- 7. Strongly supports the current actions of the UN Special Envoy to Syria in negotiating freeze zones;
- 8. Recommends the release of political war prisoners;
- 9. Demands the Syrian government and moderate rebels to cease combat with rebels and transition to a Democratic government that represents the Syrian people;
- Recommends the placement of UN peacekeepers in freeze zones as well as aid convoys;
- 11. Strongly recommends a fair public vote for citizens of Syria;
- 12. Stresses the importance of holding all parties accountable for their actions;
- 13. Recommends that if parts of Syria are stabilized refugees should be able to reenter their country;
- 14. Encourages all nations to refrain from influencing the conflict with military aid including those supporting both the government and the rebel groups;
- 15. Strongly advises outside countries to allow refugees to seek asylum in their countries; and
- 16. Demands that all parties cease and refuse all violations of international humanitarian law.
