



**United Nations Environmental Programme**

**Topic:** Deforestation

**Sponsors:** Adopted by Consensus by all Member States of the UNEP.

Affirming that deforestation causes reduction in biodiversity,

Aware of release of greenhouse gas emissions,

Fully aware that deforestation disturbs peoples

livelihoods,

Knowing that it is the cause of animal extinctions,

Deeply concerned that the earth's forests are disappearing at a rate of thirteen million hectares of trees a year relevant to 36 football fields a minute,

Noting that each year 46 to 58 square miles of forests are being cut down,

Stressing the fact that from 1990 from 2005 3.1% of the forests cover was lost,

Recognizing that deforestation contributes to global warming and climate change,

Alarming that at this deforestation rate, all trees will be cut down in a period of a century,

Bearing in mind that it will cause trouble in water cycles, such as flash floods,

Expressing its appreciation to the UN for starting UNFF on forests,

1. Emphasizes agriculture businesses to find a way to farm more efficiently, such as crop rotation;
2. Encourages high penalty for illegally cutting down trees;
3. Requests to prohibit slash and burn farming;
4. Promoting reforestation and afforestation;
5. Designates taxes and donation for improving deforestation;
6. Suggests that schools educate children about deforestation;
7. Calls upon all member states to increase global awareness;
8. Suggests developing countries to join the REDD program;
9. Creates a program that allows students to help in habitats that need more trees;

## **Resolution UNEP/1.1**

10. Proclaims that all timberline have to take a bag of seeds so whenever somebody cuts a tree they can replant;
11. Requests that schools that use digital technology and digitalizing all school text books;
12. Recommends that we create an NGO to raise to help deforestation; and
13. Proposes that programs provide incentives to countries depending on how much carbon in their forests.
