Reaffirming our deep concern with how countries are treating refugee children when they arrive,

Emphasizing the importance of programs that help refugees,

Fully aware of programs that are currently in place to help refugees,

Desiring all volunteer countries to come together to improve refugee children lives,

Deeply concerned by the treatment and resettlement of refugee children,

1. Requests that countries be evaluated on population, violence, imports and exports, military presence, and amount of jobs;
2. Demands countries provide therapy and care when refugee children arrive, before they go to a safe country;
3. Calls upon all member states to donate money to the aid for refugees;
4. Further requests that if origin country is not suitable for refugees they will be sent to a country that is, that country will receive aid depending on how many refugees arrive;

5. Emphasizes the need of a new program to help refugees, such as a website for people to donate money to the refugees;
6. Further requests volunteer countries to teach the refugees to become independent;
7. Designates a camping challenge in which participants camp overnight with very limited supplies ,to raise awareness of refugee children's situation;
8. Endorses the idea of a running race designated to the aid of refugee children;
9. Encourages countries to send funds to build hospitals and schools in and around refugee camps;
10. Authorizes the creation of an organization that calls upon governments to pledge to donate 0.5% tax money that would fund institutions regarding refugee aid;
11. Further recommends that the tax money could assist NGO to build equipment that provides refugee shelters;
12. Emphasizes that when a country is showing no signs of improvement the government of that country should give refugees citizenship and place them in communities of similar cultures if the refugees choose to do so;Calls for schools and other communities to hold clothing and food drives to provide adequate amount of basic supplies to refugee families.
