Topic: The Situation in Syria

Co-Sponsors: The Commonwealth of Australia, the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Argentina, the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Republic of Chad, the Republic of Chile, the Republic of France, the Republic of Korea, the Republic of Lithuania, the Republic of Rwanda, the Russian

Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America

The United Nations Security Council:

Alarmed by the fact that over nine million refugees have fled Syria,

Deeply concerned by President Bashar al-Assad's grave actions inflicted on the citizens of Syria,

Desiring global action to help end the bloody civil war in Syria,

Guided by international peacekeeping attempts to help resolve this conflict,

1. Calls upon the five permanent members of the Security Council to implement trade sanctions against Russia;
 - a. Specifically oil and armory sanctions;
2. Further requests for safe refugee camps for Syrian refugees to be build;
 - a. Requests for the camps to have food, water, and medical supplies;
 - b. These resources will be provided by Non Governmental Organizations;
3. Further requests driving out the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) using 8,000 Peacekeepers who will be trained and provided by the five permanent members of the Security Council;
4. Calls upon closing the borders of Syria after drawing out ISIS and guarding the borders with Peacekeepers;
5. Considers taking Bashar Al-Assad to international court where if convicted, he will be imprisoned;

6. Further calls upon the Syrian government to hold an election for a new leader/president of the Syrian Arab Republic.
