Topic: The Situation in Ukraine

Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America

Fully aware of the challenges and threats the Russian Federation has faced in connection with the Situation in Ukraine,

Noting with regret the death and destruction caused in Crimea,

Deeply concerned by a lack of resolution in the UN Security Council,

1. Expresses its hope in coming to a diplomatic solution rather than continued destruction and violence;
2. Further Encourages the Russian Federation to work through the United Nations to form a peaceful resolution;
3. Establishes a 24 hour hotline where people are able to keep up to date with all that is occurring and ask important questions if needed;
4. This service will be provided by Non-Governmental Organizations in accordance with the United Nations;
5. Approves an economic trade agreement between the Russian Federation and Ukraine creating a mutually beneficial import/export system;
6. Further invites letting the Russian Federation to purchase lease farming land owned by Crimea and/or Ukraine while maintaining their national sovereignty;
 - a. This trade agreement will mutually benefit both the Russian Federation and Ukraine through an agricultural sustainment and economic development;
7. Ensures that the ceasefire in Eastern Ukraine and Crimea will stand between both Russia and Ukraine;

8. Further encourages the two nations to continue imports and exports in order to sustain their economic and basic needs;
9. Recommends the European Union to accept Ukraine with open arms into their alliance;
 - a. This entrance into the EU will prevent any further violence between the Russian Federation and Ukraine;
10. Confirms that Ukraine will have a developed economy due to the crops Russia will grow and purchase;
11. Designates United Nations Peacekeepers in Crimea solely for the protection and monitoring of the Russian Black Sea fleets in order to prevent further military confrontations.
