

Draft Resolution Legal/2/2.3

Legal Committee

Topic: “Rule of Law at National and International Levels”

Recalling the resolution of signed on 14 December 2015 for the rule of law at national and international levels,

Noting with regret the lives that were lost due to illegal acts,

Aware of developing countries struggling to create a proper government as well as developed countries struggles to create a government that satisfies all,

Believing that there should be national laws created to fit countries’ political, social, and economical environment,

Having devoted attention to the biased choices made by the government officials contemplating the thought of changing the international criminal court in some way to assure justice for all,

Emphasizing that discrimination is a large factor in the unfair choices made by government officials,

Desiring with education of children about the rule of law and virtues,

Appreciating the work of the International Law Development Organization,

Further reminds that laws are rules and rules were made to be followed, and without laws, everything would be chaos; therefore, we suggest the following:

1. Confident that advertising through the internet, social media, newspapers, etc. will help uphold the rule of law;
2. Convinced that sending experts in teaching and counseling to influence and educate the children and the population;
3. Fully believing that influencing the public to donate money to organizations that help uphold the rule of law;
4. Expressing its hope to increase the amount of criminal court and law enforcement to reduce the possibility of crime;
5. Observing that the ICC has some weak points, such as continuously making biased decisions, and needs to be improved;
6. Suggests that the ICC takes steps towards being completely unbiased;
7. Recommends that annual government check-ups should be conducted by the UN to confirm that steps are being taken to create a stable government system;
8. Further recommends that more national laws should be created to work with its country based on its political, economical, and social environment;
9. Calls upon countries and states to aid by all laws that refer to themselves;
10. In conclusion, encouraging these procedures to enhance the rule of law.
