Topic: "Promotion and Protection of the rights of children"

Reaffirming the sustainability for the housing of every child, Taking note that education is a key to ending poverty, Bearing in mind that the fourth SDG is to ensure equitable education and promote lifelong opportunities for all, Affirming that children with disabilities need more assistance,

1. Further invites governments to make birth registration available to all;
2. Expressing its hope that all children should have access to police under all circumstances;
3. Recommends to create more healthcare infrastructure;
4. Further invites that every child has access to fundamental needs;
5. Requests implementation of shelters with educational resources in all areas that require it;
6. Emphasizes that all countries should provide children with safe, adequate, and accessible education;
7. Calls upon the participation of children in the media and in the government;
8. Proclaims that all opportunities should be available to children with disabilities.
