Topic: Destruction of Chemical Weapons

Deeply concerned that chemical weapons are still being used and stockpiled after observing their continuous effects,

Noting with satisfaction that most nations are making an effort to eliminate and dispose of chemical weapons with the help of the CWC,

Guided by the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) and Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW),

Endorsing the idea that the OPCW's membership must increase;

Recommends that countries educate their citizens about chemical weapons and agents;

Encourages the Security Council to impose sanctions on those nations with chemical weapons;

Calls upon countries who have not signed or ratified the CWC to do so;

Calls for the OPCW to conduct yearly checks by the joint investigative mechanism to make sure member states are disposing of their chemical weapons;

Recommends for the OPCW to create a document for all nations and their leaders to sign that states they do not have chemical weapons;

Designates a hot-line for calling about chemical weapons incidents;

Requests the creation of chemical weapon free zones;

Further requests the creation of an aid service for victims of chemical weapons;

Encourages governments not to trade with nations that possess chemical weapons;

Supports safe disposal of chemical weapons to reduce risks of harming humans and environment;

Proclaims that countries that still have chemical weapons should dispose a percentage of them annually;

Desiring the knowledge of chemical weapon documents that are not from government organizations.
