Topic: Fair Trade policies to defeat inequality worldwide

The Committee,

Declaring that fair trade is not about to feed the people around the world, it is mainly about that everyone can get what they deserve,

Noting with regret that there is a huge amount of people worldwide who do not get a fair share of money, especially workers in developing countries,

Realising the main causes of the inequality when people are trading their goods are the difference of wealth and strength between countries;

1. Recommends the countries that are facing problems related to the fair trade of agricultural products make a specific amount of money which proves the basic need of the workers;
2. Encourages the workers to hand in their products to the government;
3. Further recommends the developing countries people go to the developed countries like the United States of America and the United Kingdom to study their new, technologies, smarts and back to their countries to make their countries better;
4. Reminds that after checking the quality of the products, the government should give the workers an amount of money which has been mentioned before;

5. Requests government to help the workers to sell their products and return them a percentage of the extra money which is more than the money given to the workers before;
6. Takes note of that if the workers cannot hand in enough products because of unexpected disasters, the government will still give them the basic money if they hand in the application form with the assignment of relative people;
7. Expresses its hope to the UN and FAO that if the government does not have enough money to give to the workers the UN and FAO would fund the government;
8. Calls upon the highly developed countries can invest more money with the main attractions of the developing countries.
